Pick up your mid-year contribution statement Sunday, July 16th and Sunday, July 23rd in the Vestibule.

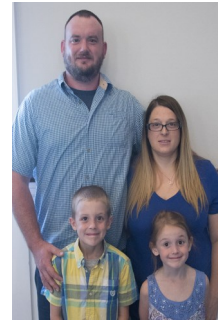

ANNIE MOSES BAND IN CONCERT! AWARD-WINNING SIBLING FOLK BAND MAKES STOP ON TOUR IN MT. WASHINGTON KY, AUG 27, 2017
