A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR



Dear First Baptist Family,

You have blessed our church with your tithes and offerings for the first half of 2016! I can't thank you enough for your generous support of First Baptist Church and its ever-increasing ministries. We express sincere appreciation to you for investing in our church while honoring God with your finances. You're asked to pick up your mid-year contribution statement Sunday July 24th or July 31st.

The first half of 2016 has been a significant time for success in ministry. Your generosity has demonstrated a servant's heart by sending and financially supporting mission teams to Eastern Kentucky, inner-city Louisville, Scotland and the back yards of The Meadows and Trevor Court Apartments in Mt. Washington.

We have fulfilled The Great Commission by contributing approximately \$71,780.59 to the Cooperative Program which supports over 5,000 North American and 5,000 International Missionaries.

We sponsored Vacation Bible School with over 341 in enrollment, with 23 expressing an interest in learning more about becoming a Christian, and offerings received to provide 37 pair of new school shoes for the multi-housing back yard VBS children in Mt. Washington.

We now have in our **Foundations for the Future** Building Fund \$1,918,804.65 which will contribute to expanded ministries for the future.

As we continue through this year, we encourage you to remember your commitment to faithful giving is an important part of your spiritual growth. Jesus said, *"Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also"* (Matt.6:21). Because of your giving, our church can continue to say "yes" to ministry opportunities.
